Module 5. Editing photos and videos on your smartphone

The module "Editing photos and videos on your smartphone" builds on the skills developed in previous modules by focusing on editing techniques that allow learners to enhance their photos and videos, tell stronger stories, and prepare content for online sharing. It was developed in an interactive format, which can be used in different environments such as a single workshop, a multi-day training, or in blended, online, or face-to-face formats.

The **aim** of this module is to enable learners to use smartphone editing apps with confidence, apply both basic and advanced editing techniques, and create an efficient workflow for managing and preparing content. The module also introduces best practices for exporting and sharing edited visuals on different platforms such as Instagram, Facebook, and TikTok.

The **structure** of the module combines demonstrations, practice, and group reflection. Activities include:

- Icebreakers using filters and quick adjustments to spark creativity.
- App exploration to become familiar with popular editing tools for photos and videos.
- Hands-on editing exercises for photos and videos, applying both basic and advanced techniques.
- Workflow tips to save time, stay consistent, and stay organized.
- Export and sharing practice with platform-specific settings.
- Optional group projects where participants apply all learned skills in creating a short video or photo series.

Educators can use the module as a complete package or select specific activities to suit learners' needs, language levels, and digital competencies. Each section includes learning outcomes, activity descriptions, materials needed, and timing suggestions, as well as tips for the facilitators, making it practical and easy to integrate into diverse teaching contexts.

Ultimately, this module empowers educators to help migrant and refugee women not only create their own digital content but also refine it into engaging, professional, and shareable material for personal, community, or entrepreneurial purposes.

tools. Let the participants to explore a bit and install the one they find the most fitting. Ask them to install one photo editor and one video.			





Activity 5.2 Editing Photos	on
Your Smartphone	

Demonstrate basic photo editing tools that can be found in most of the apps:

- Adjust brightness, contrast, saturation
- Use the "Crop" tool to align the composition
- Apply a filter

Practical activity:

Participants select a photo they have taken in the previous workshop and perform the following tasks under guidance:

- Correcting exposure and colors.
- Removing unwanted elements using a "Healing" tool or "Crop"
- Enhancing focus with selective editing (e.g., sharpening details).
- Background removal, if the app they use has the feature (Canva, PixIr have it)

At the end participants present their edited photos to the group.

- Understanding the functionality of photo editing apps
- Learn basic photo editing techniques
- Offer individual assistance and answer questions
- Optionally, if people struggle with using the apps, provide a step by step workflow (see below)

Activity 5.3 Editing Videos on Your Smartphone Demonstrate basic video editing tools that can be found in most of the apps: • Trim clips to remove unnecessary parts. • Add transitions for smooth scene changes • Incorporate background music or voiceovers to enhance storytelling. • Add filters for consistent style Practical activity: Split the participants into 4 groups and assign one app for each group. Participants select a few videos from their gallery, they can be from the previous workshop or from their personal archieve.  Create a short video (10-15 seconds) Use basic tools to adjust length, sequence clips, and apply transitions. Add text or a simple filter for visual consistency. Add music or voiceover 					
After they finish, they share the videos with the group on a common WhatsApp group or Facebook Group, previously created.					
Offer constructive feedback and ask the others to also express their opinions focusing on pacing, transitions and overrall story, if there is any.					
As a final question ask the participants what they found more interesting in the process and if they found it easy or difficult.

 Special effects like slow motion, speed ramping or masking

Ask the participants to use the photo/videos from the previous activity and enhance them using the advanced features. Suggested tasks:

- Apply colour grading to create a certain mood
- Add dynamic text or stickers for Tik-Tok/Instagram engament
- Experiment with split screens, overlays or creative transitions

Encourage the participants to play and be creative, there is no right or wrong

At the end ask the participants to share in the group their photos/videos. Discuss with the group what do they think about the use of advanced tools to improve storytelling

- Showing examples of before and after, would also help the participants better understand the process.
- If working with more advanced participants, you can ask them to guess what kind of edits were made to a certain video/photo and then discuss them further.

Explain how to reduce file size without compromising quality for faster uploads.			
Ask the participants to export the photos/videos they have edited previously using platform specific settings and then try to upload them, if they agree.			





Participants are split in small groups and they have to create a short 30 sec video or a series of 3-5 photos. The content could have different thematics:

- 1. Empowering messages for migrant/refugee women
- Promoting a product or a set of products designed/created by migrant/refugee women.

Let the participants choose between the 2. They have to use everything they learnt before and apply it to their project.

Each group shares their project on the Workshop's platform (closed group), either Whatsapp group or Facebook. The facilitator and participants provide constructive feedback on the technical aspects and storytelling.

*This can be used as an activity they could do in the free time, after the workshop.

Applying the learned skills by creating a short visual content project

This final project can be done either at the end of Module 4 or Module 5, if the planned workshops include both modules, they can have this small project as a final assignment before finishing the whole course, as it includes all the competences acquired during both workshops.

Quick Guide: Editing Photos on Your Smartphone

Snapseed (Best for Precise Editing)

Steps:

- 1. Open Snapseed → Import photo
- 2. Use *Tune Image* (brightness, contrast, saturation)
- 3. Try Selective Adjust to fix specific areas
- 4. Export \rightarrow Save a copy

Tip: Use *Healing Tool* to remove unwanted spots or objects.

Lightroom Mobile (Best for Professional-Looking Edits)

Steps:

- 1. Import photo \rightarrow Open *Light* panel (exposure, highlights, shadows)
- 2. Adjust *Color* (temperature, vibrance, saturation)
- 3. Apply presets for quick professional looks
- 4. Export in high resolution

Tip: Keep edits subtle for natural results.

VSCO (Best for Stylish Filters & Mood)

Steps:

- 1. Import photo \rightarrow Apply filter (choose mood: bright, vintage, muted)
- 2. Adjust intensity → Fine-tune exposure/contrast
- 3. Save & export

Tip: Create a "look" by using the same filter for consistency on social media.





Canva (Best for Text, Collages & Social Media Posts)

- Steps:
 - 1. Choose *Photo Template* (IG Post, Story, FB Cover, etc.)
 - 2. Upload your photo \rightarrow Add text, graphics, stickers
 - 3. Export \rightarrow Share directly

Tip: Great for creating flyers, posters, or branded content.

Remember: Always save a copy of your original photo. **Workflow hack:** Basic adjustments first \rightarrow Apply filters \rightarrow Add text/effects \rightarrow Export.





Quick Guide: Editing Videos on Your Smartphone

CapCut (Best for TikTok & Reels)

- Steps:
 - 1. Open \rightarrow New Project \rightarrow Import clips
 - 2. Trim/split, add text, transitions, filters
 - 3. Export 1080p → Share to TikTok/IG

Tip: Try "Templates" for trendy edits in seconds.

InShot (Best for Stories & Posts)

- Steps:
 - 1. Import video → Choose *Canvas* size (9:16 for Stories, 1:1 for feed)
 - 2. Trim/merge → Add stickers, text, music
 - 3. Export $1080p \rightarrow Upload$ to IG/FB/TikTok

Tip: Use "Canvas" to auto-fit social media dimensions.

Canva (Best for Polished/Branded Content)

- Steps:
 - 1. Pick a Video Template (IG Story, Reel, FB Post)
 - 2. Replace stock with your clips \rightarrow Add text/graphics/music
 - 3. Download MP4 (1080p) \rightarrow Post anywhere

Tip: Great for adding logos and consistent branding.





Instagram Editor (Best for Instant Posting)

- Steps:
 - 1. Open IG \rightarrow Tap + \rightarrow Import or record
 - 2. Trim \rightarrow Add filters, text, stickers, music
 - 3. Publish with caption/hashtags

Tip: Use IG music library for easy trending sounds.

Remember: Always export in **1080p** for sharp quality.

Workflow hack: Trim clips first \rightarrow Add effects \rightarrow Export \rightarrow Post.
